The decision is made after carefully considering the weather forecast and the condition of the roads in Mountville and our parking lot.

It is our hope that all persons will give priority to their health and safety when making a decision about traveling to church activities and worship services when the weather and road conditions are not optimal.



Great Responses at Congregational “Futures” Conversations

On Nov. 8, 2015, after a carry-in fellowship meal, Mountville folks sat down around tables to talk about the future they envision for our church---their dreams and hopes for the coming years as well as highlighting the meaningful experiences that mark our life together now. The Leadership Team designed this discussion to offer the entire congregation opportunity to share their dreams and concerns about our congregational life in the coming years.

Conversation took place around tables in groups of 6-8, guided by a facilitator. Comments were recorded and will be used by the Leadership Team in the planning process for ministries in 2016 and beyond. Much analysis is yet to be done, but a preliminary review of the comments showed:

- Our worship experience received high ratings and much appreciation.
- Support to explore and implement local community-based ministries.
- Appreciation for welcoming and hospitality ministries.
- Support for new small group experiences.
- Desire to include young families in the life of the congregation.

Leadership Team is committed to using this information in creative, constructive ways as the planning for future ministries unfolds. They are also committed to sharing the results of their analysis, planning, and proposals with the congregation in ways that encourage congregational response and support. 

GUIDING LIGHT

Make this flashlight to remember that God, our light, always shows us the way.



What you need:

- Flashlight with handle strap
- Yarn (6 to 8 inches)
- Colorful pony beads
- Stickers (including foam letters)
- Batteries

What you do:

1. Tie the yarn through the flashlight's handle strap so two equal lengths hang down.
2. String the pony beads onto the two yarn lengths, and secure the ends with knots.
3. Decorate the flashlight with stickers. Use letters to spell "God is light."
4. Keep the flashlight by your bedside as a reminder of God's guidance. Use the flashlight to read a Bible verse before bed each night!



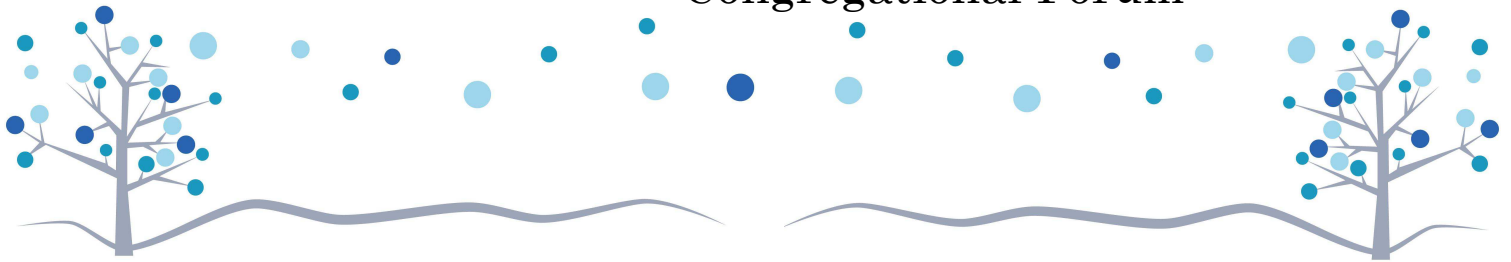
