Offering will be divided between local and global ministries.

Local: Surprise Gift to UNR Youth NYC Fund (25%)

National Youth Conference is an every four year "mountaintop" opportunity for Sr. High COB youth. Registration is \$550 per youth, plus transportation costs to Fort Collins, CO. Our sister congregation, Un Nuevo Renacer, has more than a dozen youth interested in NYC and a challenging fundraising goal.

Local: Healthy Steps Diaper Bank-Lancaster County (25%)

Healthy Steps is central PA's only diaper bank. Diapers are not covered by safety net programs, so parents often face tough choices keeping their young one's clean and dry when budgets are tight.

Global: Haiti COB Medical Mission Latrines (50%)

The Brethren Medical Missions team, which provides medical clinics and supplies to Haitians, has launched a campaign to build latrines for the Brethren communities in order to guard health and drinking supplies. Each latrine is expected to cost \$600.
