

### CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING – Gifts for the Christ Child

Your gifts will be shared equally with:

**New Community Project's Midwife Training in DRC.** The Democratic Republic of Congo faces an on-going crisis in maternal/newborn care. A woman dies in childbirth every 25 minutes in the DRC, and the risk of dying during birth is 1 in 24. Almost 5% newborns die at birth or immediately after. Two months training for 50 midwives costs \$1,500; Practitioner's Kits containing disinfectant, gloves and other essentials are \$40/ midwife.

**Parish Resource Center's Baby Kits to Union Community Care,** the medical provider for many local low-income families. They have requested Baby Kits to provide new moms with essentials to start them out right. Qualifying new mothers and babies are released from the hospital with a diaper bag full of basics.
