Love Notes from Pastor Angela

February 22 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. It falls 40 days (excluding Sundays) before Easter Sunday. Lent is a time of intentional spiritual discipline. For some people, that means giving up something, turning Lent into a kind of "holy diet". For others, it's a time of adding something, like a daily prayer ritual.

In anticipation of our Lenten journey together, we will share a special service on Sunday, February 19 with the theme "Emptied". Be encouraged to empty yourself in order to receive God's grace anew. As part of worship that Sunday, we will offer a time of anointing.

Then, we will spend time preparing ourselves for the joy of Easter by studying the Gospel of John – specifically chapters 13 – 21. I will be planning my sermons around Warren Wiersbe's book, *Be Transformed*.

This book was not written as a Lenten devotional, however the introduction lists four "habits" to keep you dependent on Jesus, no matter what comes your way. In my mind, "habit" is another word for "discipline". It's a way of being.

The four habits we'll be focusing on are: Trusting Jesus, Loving one another, Relying on the work of the Holy Spirit, and Prayer.

The first twelve chapters of the Gospel of John recount Jesus' public ministry. But chapters 13-21 are private conversations between Jesus and the disciples closest to him. They are his teachings on the transforming power of joy for those who chose to follow him and carry on his message. You know, us \odot

I pray that you will be a part of our Lenten journey here, and that you will be transformed in the process.

Deadlines

Church Table and Chair Loan Policy


Church members are allowed to borrow a maximum of 4 tables and chairs as needed. They are to be returned a.s.a.p. or within 4 days after pick-up. We ask that the tables be cleaned before returning and notify Jackie if there is any damage. Please call the church office to check on availability and to reserve the tables / chairs you need.

Flowers for the Worship Center

If you would like to place flowers in the worship center in memory or in honor of someone, please see the flower chart located in the hallway by the kitchen. There you may sign up for your special date and write what you would like put in the bulletin and if you would like an arrangement: \$35 or 2 vases: \$40. Orders are placed monthly with Schaefer's Flowers about 1 week prior to the upcoming month. Fill out a pink form by the flower chart and return with payment to the church office or offering plate. You may call Schaefer's directly to place a special request. You may also choose a different florist. Please contact the church office if you plan to use a different florist so you won't be billed twice. Thank you.

Placing Items in the Refrigerator / Freezer

When placing items in the refrigerator or freezer please put your name and date on a label and attach it to each item of food and/or drink. Labels are located on both the freezer and refrigerator doors. This will help keep your items from being taken accidently and will help us know who to contact if there are any questions about the food.
