New Small Group Bible Study

Would you like to be a part of a once-in-a-lifetime experience? In celebration of 500 years of the Anabaptist faith tradition, we are joining with 499 other primarily Brethren and Mennonite congregations to create the *Anabaptist Community Bible*, which will be published by MennoMedia on the 500th anniversary in 2025.



This unique Bible will contain margin notes created by Anabaptist Biblical Scholars, Anabaptist Historians, and congregations - like us! - and will offer a fresh engagement with Scripture, renewed faith in Jesus, stronger faith communities, and a more vibrant witness in the world.

Our congregation has been assigned the following passages to study together:

Daniel 5:17-31, Daniel 6:1-28, 1 John 1, 1 John 2, Psalm 136:1-12

We will gather Monday evenings at **6:30 p.m.** in the fellowship hall on the following dates: **April 24, May 1, May 8, and May 22**. Each participant will be given a study guide, which you will use in the week leading up to our gathering. During our gathering time, we will share together the insights or questions that arose in our personal devotional time. These thoughts will be compiled into "notes" that will be provided to the Bible editorial team.

Congregational Forum Report

The Congregational Forum was held on February 26. During the meeting year end reports were given. The 2022 year ended with a budget surplus. The Leadership team recommended that the church spend it in three ways: "Add" to the Endowment fund, 'Save' to the Building Maintenance Fund, 'Give' to the Brethren Disaster Ministries fund specifically to the Turkey and Syria Earthquake relief efforts. Forum approved the allocation of \$7,000 to each area. Tom Musser shared that our Afghan Refugee resettlement has gone very well. Walt Vanderheijden gave an update from the Core Values team. We will be meeting in small groups again to discuss the vision we have for the church. The Congregational Fellowship Events committee was introduced. They will be planning 3-4 church events this year. The Photo Directory Committee was also introduced and shared what research they have found on using and making an online church directory.

As part of our Congregational Business Forum we adopted a new Statement of Purpose as part of our Core Values work.
