Love Notes from Pastor Angela

So those who welcomed his message were baptized...They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ~~ Acts 2:41-42

In 1525, a group of people set out to live the practices of the early believers described in Acts. Based on their communal understanding of Scripture, they rejected the ordinance of infant baptism, stating they found no example of this practice in the Bible.

Being re-baptized as adults led to persecution, as it was against the law. It also led to a new name: *Anabaptists* – which literally means "baptized anew."

In addition to being known for their practice of adult baptism, members of Anabaptist faith traditions also emphasize discipleship, peacemaking, and recognizing the presence of Christ in the gathered community of faith. And, they prioritize the teachings of Jesus in Scripture. Today, the largest sects of Anabaptists are Mennonites and Brethren.

In celebration of 500 years of the Anabaptist faith tradition, we are joining with 499 other primarily Brethren and Mennonite congregations from around the world to create the Anabaptist Community Bible, which will be published by Menno-Media in 2025. This unique Bible (featuring the Common English Bible translation) will contain margin notes created by Anabaptist Biblical Scholars, Anabaptist Historians, and congregations - like us! - and will offer a fresh engagement with Scripture, renewed faith in Jesus, stronger faith communities, and a more vibrant witness in the world. We'll even be included in the acknowledgements as contributors!

Our congregation has been assigned the following passages to study together: Daniel 5:17-31, Daniel 6:1-28, 1 John 1, 1 John 2, Psalm 136:1-12.



National Day of Prayer



For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them. ~~ Matthew 18:20

Just as we did in March for *World Day of Prayer*, we will gather on on **Thursday**, **May 4 at 10:00 a.m.** in room 102 for the *National Day of*

Prayer. The National Day of Prayer shares a history with our Thanksgiving holiday. While under British rule, the New England colonies practiced two days each year of prayer: the day in late fall called for prayer and thanksgiving, while the day in spring called for prayer and fasting. In 1863, President Lincoln established the fall day of prayer as the official Thanksgiving holiday. In 1952, under President Truman, the spring day of prayer became the National Day of Prayer. All are welcome to join in this time of prayer, even if you aren't comfortable praying aloud. Your presence is prayerful. Please send your prayer concerns to Pastor Angela by Tuesday, May 2 so that she can prepare the prayer list for Thursday.

Celebrate Pentecost!



Pentecost is a day of celebration! We celebrate the birth of the Christian Church, and God's promise kept through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The description of this event is found in Acts 2. In verse 6, "the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard [the disciples] speaking in the native language of each."

On Pentecost **Sunday, May 28**, we will share a joint service with our brothers and sisters from Un Nuevo Renacer Church of the Brethren. They will lead us in one praise hymn, and they will join our choir to sing an anthem and provide percussion. Epi Cosme will serve as worship leader, and we will pray - together - in one accord but with multiple voices. This is a service you won't want to miss - come and celebrate the Spirit's movement through our larger community of faith!
