Love Notes from Pastor Angela

Each year, in the weeks leading up to the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference, it has been my habit to explore the conference's overarching theme by preaching the daily themes and scriptures set by the Annual Conference moderator.

This year's conference takes place in Cincinnati, OH from July 4-8, and this year's moderator, Tim McElwee has selected the theme *Living God's Love*. In choosing this theme, Tim wrote that it "is based on Ephesians 5:1-2, but the central message is found throughout the Bible. In fact, I think this calling is the most basic and most important teaching we can commit ourselves to live out as disciples of Jesus Christ."

He continued: "To illustrate the call to live God's gift of inclusive love, our Annual Conference logo this year refers to the three words, Living God's Love, as they appear in English, along with the translation of these three powerful words in Spanish, Creole, and Hausa [languages spoken where the CoB has a significant presence]. We are truly a global church and no matter where we live, we are called to live God's love in a bold, compassionate, and inclusive manner—which is how God loves us."

That theme certainly resonates with me, and it absolutely fits with *our* new purpose statement: "In joyful community, we follow Jesus to embody God's love with all our neighbors." In other words, we practice together "Living God's Love."

We have been spending time as a congregation naming the Core Values that will help us fulfill our purpose statement. Moderator McElwee has his own recommendations for how to Live God's Love, encouraging us to "make a commitment to seek out those in your midst who may not often experience the love of God. Search for those in your community and in your church who are often marginalized, ignored, or forgotten...then demonstrate God's love for them as completely and as fully as you possibly can."

I look forward to digging into this theme and these scriptures this summer during Sunday worship. And then, I encourage you to watch the Annual Conference worship services online [you'll be provided with the link] to hear how others have been inspired by these texts. We learn so much from one another.



Warmer Weather Tips

It is treat to finally get outside in the beautiful weather, and here are some reminders of how to stay safe and healthy!



- * Use insect repellent and wear long sleeves and long pants to prevent mosquito bites and ticks. If using sunscreen and insect repellant, put the sunscreen on first. Check the expiration dates on sunscreen and insect repellent, as they will not be effective if expired.
- * Stay hydrated!! Be sure to drink plenty of water . . . If you don't like water, try adding a slice of fruit to it or try sparking water (seltzer water). Check the label to be sure there is not an artificial sweetener added. Fruits and most vegetables are made up of a large percentage of water, so consuming these is another way of adding water to your daily consumption.

Traditionally the Host City for Annual Conference chooses a program to support. Each congregation is asked to donate items on the list provided or monetary contributions. This year the Annual Conference is being held at Duke Energy Convention Center, Cincinnati, Ohio, July 4-8 (Tuesday - Saturday). The Witness contribution to the Host City is going to Found House. Found House Interfaith Housing Network's mission provides shelter, housing, and support to families experiencing housing insecurity and

to strengthen those services through interfaith and community partnerships.

To make monetary donations write your check to: Mountville Church of the Brethren and make sure it is in the church's hands by Sunday, June 18. Please write Annual Conference on the memo line of your check.

How you can help: Annual Conference has asked Found House what items are most needed to support the families they serve. This is what they need:

- * Gift cards to: Kroger, Walmart, Meijer, Target \$25 denominations work best for their distribution.
- * Laundry detergent pods
- * Cleaning supplies: disinfecting wipes, disinfectant spray, Windex, multi-purpose cleaner, air freshener, hand soap, dish detergent.
- * Bottled water, cans of soup, juice boxes, paper towels, toilet paper.
- * Breakfast bars, cereal, Pop Tarts
- * Snacks: single serving size: peanut butter/cheese crackers, fruit snacks, Granola bars, chips, Mac 'n Cheese cups.
- * Wet or dry dog food, wet or dry cat food, dog treats, cat carriers, dog leashes.

The list will be posted on the bulletin board at church.

Pastor Angela will be driving to the Conference this year and has volunteered to take items with her. She is leaving Thursday, June 29. If anyone wishes to send anything with her please have it in her hands by Tuesday, June 27.
