## Love Notes from Pastor Angela

*They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore. ~ Isaiah 2:4*

I'm writing this article on my first day back from Annual Conference, reflecting on the experience. I woke early for my first day of Conference, heading to the convention center at 6:30 a.m. for the Clergy Women's Breakfast.

As I left my hotel, I confronted police tape completely surrounding the entrance, blocking busy downtown streets. I learned that an 18-year-old woman had been shot and killed at 2:30 that morning, five floors below where I was sleeping. A 13-year-old had also been wounded. Shock and grief overwhelmed me for lives shattered much too soon.

As I prayed and lamented, I began thinking about the lives of many people I've known and loved that have been destroyed by gun violence, and I was astonished to realize that I've known more people impacted by gun violence than fatal car accidents! This is not something that only happens to "other people."

These deep emotions compelled me to join with our agency, On Earth Peace, in a vigil to lament gun violence (which had already been planned months in advance). At the vigil, Cincinnati's Vice Mayor reminded us that the Church of the Brethren had issued a statement condemning gun violence as early as 1978.

We are not simply an historic peace church – we are a *living peace church*, called to bring about God's peaceable kingdom. That call has never been more urgent.

Brothers and sisters, this is a statement of faith. It's an acknowledgement of our broken humanity – one that so often seeks to harm another. It's an appeal towards actions of healing. The impacts of violence not only affect the immediate victims, they ripple through our society leaving a legacy of pain. I know this first hand, through multiple experiences.

Join me in prayer and in discernment for what is ours to do as we seek to serve Jesus – the Prince of Peace.




