Love Notes from Pastor Angela

In prayer there is a connection between what God does and what you do. You can't get forgiveness from God, for instance, without also forgiving others.

If you refuse to do your part, you cut yourself off from God's part.

~~ Matt. 6:14-15, The Message

These words of Jesus come at the end of the Lord's prayer. There is no "amen" in this passage, so Jesus' teaching on how to pray flows right into this text, and repeats v. 12 (a part of the prayer we have memorized) "forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors."

Forgiveness. It's an important part of our prayer life, and an important part of our communal life. It's an important part of our preparation for *Love Feast*, which takes place <u>Sunday</u>, <u>October 8 at 6:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall</u>. Prior to Love Feast, we are to examine our relationships with our siblings in Christ. If there is any need for repair or restoration of any of these relationships, this reconciliation must be a priority.

Forgiveness is what keeps a vibrant congregation (or a vibrant relationship of any kind) healthy. Given the importance of forgiveness to our faith and communal well-being, we will spend three weeks during October exploring different aspects of forgiveness, including the need to forgive ourselves.

At the conclusion of worship on October 22, we will gather in the Garden of Release, where we will lay down our private resentments or items in need of forgiveness, and leave them at the feet of the One whose radical forgiveness makes us whole.

Pinwheels for Peace

Since its inception, the Church of the Brethren has sought to be a living peace community. We seek to be Christians, called by God to give witness to the gospel of peace. In annual Conference statements from 1978, 1987, 1994, and 1999, members have been called to address the violent epidemic of gun violence. In seeking to stem this rushing tide of tragedy, we give action to our purpose statement, "to embody God's love with all our neighbors." We also actively pursue our mission to strengthen our community connections and strive to reflect God's light in the world. The Church has grown in its understanding of the complexity of peace, and now understands it as not merely the opposite of war.

September 21, 2023 is International Peace Day. Mountville Church of the Brethren is "planting" 216 children's pinwheels on the lawn of the church. <u>Each pinwheel represents one of the 216 children who die of gun violence in the United States every month.</u> **Pinwheels for Peace** seeks to raise awareness of the magnitude of this national tragedy, and to follow the biblical admonition in Proverbs 34:14, "...seek peace and pursue it."

On Thursday, September 21 an outdoor vigil will be held at 7:00 p.m. to remember the child victims of gun violence. The **Pinwheels for Peace** remembrance week begins during worship service on September 17, when members of the congregation will bring forward a child's pinwheel which will be "planted' on the church lawn after the service. After the Thursday vigil, participants are invited to take a pinwheel home and plant it in a place of prayer and meditation to pray for the children. As we pray for the children of this nation we can recall Proverbs 34: 15, "The eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and the ears are attentive to their cry."

God is Doing a New Thing!



This portion of scripture from Isaiah 43:19 was the theme for the 16th NOAC (National Older Adult Conference) September 4-8, 2023. NOAC is held at Lake Junaluska Conference and Retreat Center in the mountains of western North Carolina. This is a great location for a retreat - a beautiful lake with swans and geese, many trees and walking trails.

As one might expect at a church conference, there were early morning Bible studies, keynote addresses with talk back sessions and worship services with much stirring singing and preaching. But there were also bus trips available to local sites, for example, the museum of the Cherokee Indian and Village, or Carl Sandburg's home and farm. You could join a service project such as assembling hygiene kits (1375 were completed) or the fundraising walk around the lake (85 participants who raised \$4,532. There were workshops available with topics relating to Brethren Stories of work done around the world, seeing places in Europe which were important to the formation of the Brethren Movement, learning about the EYN Church in Nigeria, building bridges to embrace diversity and many more topics - we didn't have enough time to attend all of the ones we found interesting. And, of course, if you are at a church camp, there must be arts and crafts! Again, there were many choices - Pastor Angela led one on "Bound for Fun" (bookbinding), torn paper collage (ask my husband to see the one he made) and tie dyeing (a perpetual favorite). I made a tie dyed tee shirt which I will wear some Sunday.

Literally, there is something for everyone. As you can see, there are many activities, but there are also places to sit quietly along the lake or near the 25-foot tall illuminated cross at Inspiration Point.

So, why don't you plan on attending the next NOAC?! They are held every two years and the date for the next one is September 1-5, 2025. I think it would be great fun for a group from our church to go. The ANE district takes a bus or you can carpool.
