Love Notes from Pastor Angela

I recently ran across an article online that caught my eye:

3 Tips for a More Biblical Thanksgiving. Of course, I had to read it – it's timely, and it has a list (which, if you know me, you know I find irresistible). The author, J. Johns, offered the following three suggestions for making our lives more about gratitude.

- 1. Make your prayers of thanksgiving innocent. In other words, simply give thanks to God without seeking something in return.
- 2. Take time to reflect on the past with gratitude. The author notes that we live in a society obsessed with the future. This obsession sometimes leads to dissatisfaction with the things we have, leaving us wanting more. Looking back provides an opportunity to thank God for the many blessings that have already come our way focusing on what we have, rather than what we want. I would add that an obsession with the future can also make us worried or afraid. It is good to spend time reflecting on God's faithfulness, and giving thanks!
- 3. Lastly, the author suggests we should make our prayers inclusive. What he means by that is we should be thankful for absolutely everything the big things and the little things. The good experiences, and the difficult experiences and people who have shaped our lives.

Some people participate in a "thankfulness calendar" during the month of November. They keep a journal or take to social media to note something they are thankful for each day of the month. I like this idea.

Dear members and especially new members,



Welcome! We are so glad that you chose to join our family of believers at Mountville Church of the Brethren. We try to show caring and compassion to members and friends of our church family. One of the ways we do that is through card ministry which I coordinate. I'm writing to explain the ministry and invite you to become part of it if you'd like.

Of course, you can send cards to anyone anytime, but if there is a milestone birthday, anniversary, illness or death, I try to remind folks to be in touch. Then it's all up to you. You can choose to respond or not to respond to the email request. It's completely voluntary. YOU decide if and when you'd like to respond. If you choose to respond, just sign your card and bring to church on Sunday morning. I prepare and label card bags and they are on the round table in the narthex. Just drop in your card and save yourself the postage.

The bag will only be in the narthex on Sunday morning from 9:00 -11:00 a.m. so if you know that you won't be there then, just take your card to church anytime prior to that and drop it in my mailbox, #11, and we'll be sure that it gets in the bag on Sunday morning. We are finding that our folks really appreciate this gesture of caring. The perks are that it saves you postage and the bags are delivered after church on Sunday and either dropped off and, if desired, we visit also. The receiver is very happy to see a face from church and to know that they are not forgotten.

Please know that I do not place names on the card ministry list unless you reach out to me and ask to be part of this group. Since your names will be new to many, this is a great way for you to reach out and in no time, your name will be recognized by ALL. I keep records and check them regularly, but it's possible that I may miss an important occasion or that I don't know about it, so I always appreciate your input, additions and corrections. ANYONE can be in touch with me and ask to have someone remembered with a card bag. Since I don't text, the best way to be in touch with me is by email or phone. My contact info is in the directory. Seekers Class

On October 22, Seekers Adult Faith Formation will begin a four-part series featuring Christina Bucher. This series will be based on her recently released book with Bob Neff entitled, *Luke and Acts: Turning*



the World Upside Down! (Brethren press, 2022). This four-week series will explore key themes in the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts. In these two New Testament books, both written by the author we know as "Luke," we learn how Jesus taught his followers to live (Gospel) and how people responded to Jesus' teaching (Acts). In following Jesus, they lived in ways that sometimes challenged the values and norms of the larger society. They healed and restored relationships. They shared possessions and expanded the boundaries of their groups to include those whom society marginalized. Through these countercultural practices, Jesus' followers "turned the world upside down" (Acts 17:6).
