# CHUCK FEW SHARES HIS LOVE FOR PHOTOGRAPHY IN THE NARTHEX DISPLAY CASES IN JANUARY

Our friend and fellow congregant, Chuck Few, has been interested in photography since the 1950's when he was in grade school. His craft grew and blossomed as he and his wife, Terry, grew in their love of the camera and evolving photographic technology. Chuck even took some black and white (B&W) film shots becoming enchanted with the depth photos take on when there is no color, just light and shade to make a statement... or to tell a story.

Black and white photography is a distinct type of photography that is naturally emotive. When you strip away color from an image, it takes on a more timeless and nostalgic feeling. In a way, it forces the viewer to focus on the story of the image without being distracted by color. B&W photos show contrast, convey feelings, create a feeling of nostalgia for the passage of time. This increases the depth of drama about the story the photographer wants the picture to tell. It is indeed a challenging, special art form.
