Love Notes from Pastor Angela

"Lord, teach us to pray." ~~ Luke 11:1

These are the words of the first disciples of Jesus. They are also the words of modern-day followers of Jesus..."teach us to pray." This request represents a yearning for a deepening relationship — not only with God, but with one another. It's impossible to pray earnestly for someone and not have your heart soften towards them.

These words, "teach us to pray," were written to me earlier this year, and this is a request I delight in answering. So, for three Sundays in April, beginning the 14th, we will spend time together in Scripture learning to pray. In preparation for this precious time, I want to encourage you to find a journal, or a tablet, or the "notes" on your phone, and label it "Prayer Journal." Each week, I will give you prompts or suggestions for things to explore in your personal prayer time.

Here are your prompts for the <u>first week of April</u>. Carve out a few quiet moments and reflect on your experience of prayer.

Are there specific instances of prayer that stand out to you? If so, what made them meaningful? Was it a need you had, the setting in which you prayed, the words you expressed, or something you felt or sensed in your spirit? Record your thoughts in your journal.

What is your experience with routine times of prayer? Do you keep to a prayer schedule of sorts, praying at specific times or at certain events of the day? Or, do you find yourself uttering a one-sentence prayer as people and situations come to mind?

We will continue the process of prayerful Sunday worship and teaching along with private prayer time and journaling all month. Then, on the National Day of Prayer, Thursday, May 2, at 10:00 am, we will gather together here at the church to pray over the joys and needs of our families, our church, our neighborhood, and our world. Join me ... in prayer!

YWCA Training for Suspected Child Abuse

Pennsylvania has now included volunteers who work with children in the church setting as mandated reporters of any suspected child abuse. In order for the volunteers to be aware of what is defined as child abuse by the state, the Education Ministry team has asked a certified trainer from the YWCA to come out to the church on Wednesday, April 17 from 9 a.m. - 12 p.m., in room 102 to provide State approved, mandated reporter training. This will include the information used by the state to identify child abuse. All volunteers serving the children in our church family are encouraged to attend. This training will also be open to any individuals interested in learning how and when to report suspected child abuse. See Ginny Hart with questions.

Congregational Forum Highlights

The Congregational Forum was held on February 25. During the meeting, year end reports were given. The 2023 year ended with a budget surplus. The Leadership team recommended that the church allocate it in four ways: save for ministerial coverage during Pastor Angela's sabbatical in 2025, add to the Endowment Fund, give to Outreach Team to disburse, and save to the Building Maintenance Fund for possible use following architectural RFPs to study the safety, accessibility, and emergency aspects of our worship space and front sanctuary. Walt V. gave an update from the Core Values team. They will be looking at how the Ministry teams' activities match with our core values. Nanette B. gave a photo directory update. The Instant ChurchDirectory app and website are up to date. The supplemental directory information will be emailed when it is ready. If you don't have an email, you will be sent or given the directory.
